Description

The COVID-19 pandemic has created a challenging health care environment resulting in uncertainty and stress for patients and health care professionals. Offering quality continuing medical education (CME) during this difficult time is more vital than ever. The Massachusetts Medical Society's (MMS) Annual Accreditation Conference offers an interactive live virtual learning experience to support the professional development of CME providers and stakeholders.
