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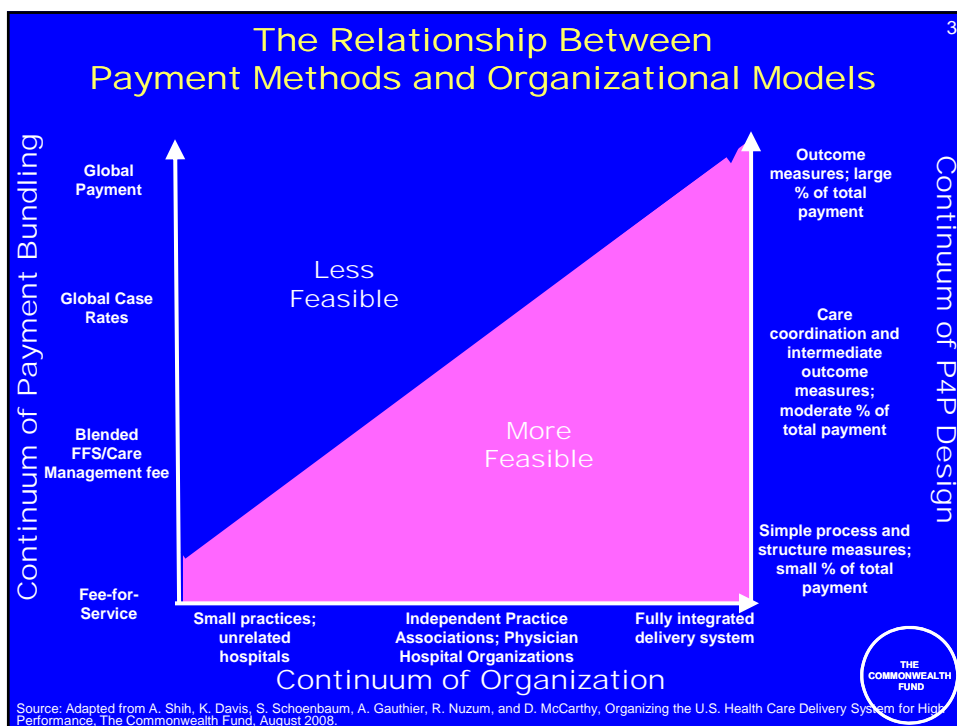

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Problems with the Current Delivery System

- Problems:
 - Fragmented care
 - Lack of accountability
 - Variable quality
 - High and rapidly-growing costs
- Policy solutions:
 - Create incentives for providers to take broader accountability for patient care, outcomes, and resource use
 - Provide rewards for improved quality and care coordination among providers
 - Put in place an infrastructure to support providers in improving quality and efficiency

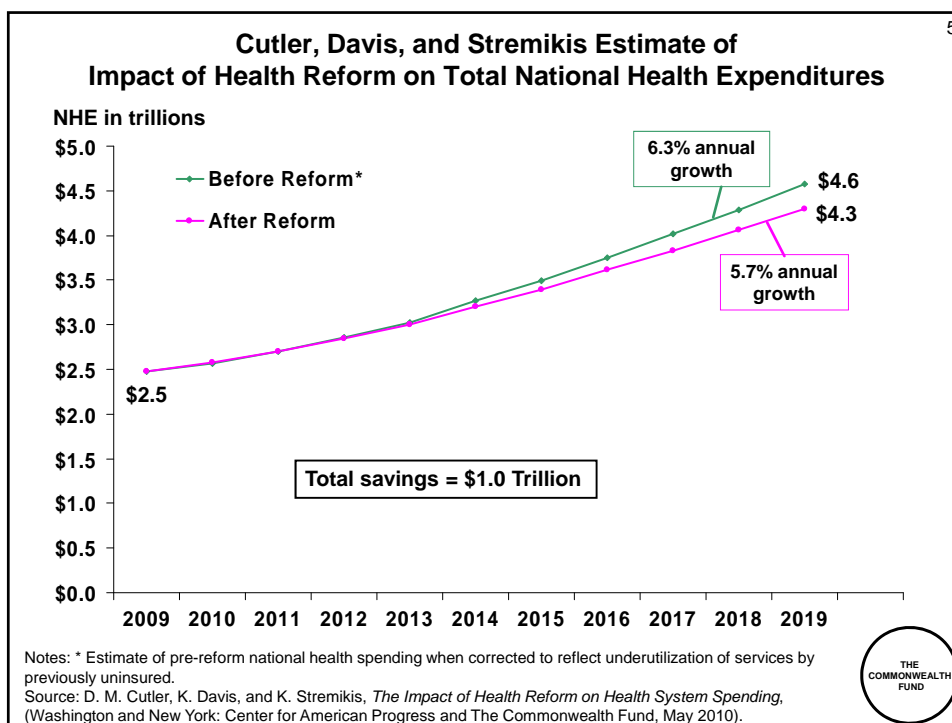




Payment Innovation in Health Reform Legislation

- Medical home: Expansion of current Medicare demonstration, new Medicare pilots, Medicaid initiatives
- ACO: Broad responsibility for quality and cost of patient care, rewards for quality, shared savings
- Bundled payments: Medicare pilots for hospital and post-acute care, Medicaid initiatives
- Center for Medicare and Medicaid Innovation
