Massachusetts provides free vaccines to all children under 19, no matter your insurance status. This helps make sure that all children and teens can receive doctor-recommended vaccinations at **no cost**.

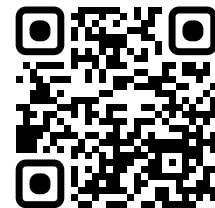
Where Can My Child Get Free Vaccines?

Vaccines are free of charge to anyone under 19 – even if they have insurance, are uninsured, or are covered through MassHealth.

Children can get recommended vaccines from:

- **A pediatrician, family physician or other health care provider**
- **A community health center**
- **Some local health departments or school based clinics**

Children do not need health insurance or a social security number to get vaccines, and parents/guardians won't be asked for payment information. If families do have health insurance, bring your insurance card to your appointment.
