



U.S. vs. median mortality rates, age 0-75







FIGURE 1-6 U.S. female life expectancy at birth relative to 21 other high-income countries, 1980-2006.




Average spending on health per capita (\$US PPP)

U.S. Prescription Drug Spending Estimates and Projections by Source, 2010-20






National Trends in Per Capita Pharmaceutical Spending, 1980–2015



Adults Who Cited Cost as a Reason for Skipping Prescriptions or Doses, 2016



Adults Who Cited Cost as a Reason for Skipping Prescriptions or Doses, by Health Status, 2016













Obesity trends* among U.S. adults, 1990




Obesity trends* among U.S. adults, 2000

(*BMI ≥30, or ~ 30 lbs. overweight for 5' 4" person)





Obesity trends* among U.S. adults, 2010

(*BMI ≥30, or ~ 30 lbs. overweight for 5' 4" person)




Life expectancy vs. health expenditure over time (1970-2014)










Adult Obesity Rates by State, 2017
