Bornstein, MD, was born on September 7, 1938, in Boston, Massachusetts, and died on June 6, 2020, succumbing to complications from Covid-19 10 11 at the age of 81; and 12 13 Whereas, Dr. Bornstein had a distinguished career in obstetrics and gynecology, 14 working at Charlton and Truesdale Memorial Hospitals in Fall River, MA, New London 15 Hospital in New London, NH, and finishing as chief of Obstetrics and Gynecology and 16 medical director at Morton Hospital in Taunton, MA. He also served as medical director 17 for Seminole Point Rehabilitation Center in Sunapee, NH, and was a former president of 18 the Bristol North District Medical Society; and 19 20 Whereas, Dr. Bornstein served in the United States Air Force during the Vietnam War 21 and obtained the rank of Lieutenant Colonel. Afterward, he graduated from Northeastern 22 University and the University of Vermont in 1965 with a degree in medicine; and 23 24 Whereas, Dr. Bornstein was a well-respected and beloved member of the community 25 and received the Bristol North District Medical Society Community Clinician of the Year 26 Award in 1999; and 27 28 Whereas, Dr. Bornstein enjoyed a variety of interests: stamp collecting, hunting, training 29 and showing dogs, coaching youth hockey, skiing, gardening, horseback riding, and 30 reading. Dr. Bornstein was a naturalist for the Mass Audubon Society and was an 31 award-winning photographer; and 32 33 Whereas, Dr. Bornstein is survived by: his two former wives Judith Green and Janet 34 Gardner; five children and their wives, Aaron and Diem Bornstein, Gary and Eser 35 Bornstein, Barry Bornstein, Michael Gardner Bornstein, Paul and Michelle Cairol-36 Bornstein; his three grandchildren Kyle, Ira, and Elia; great-granddaughter Abigail; and 37 many cousins, nieces and nephews; and 38 39 Whereas, Dr. Bornstein enjoyed many lifelong friendships and will be greatly missed by 40 all who knew him and his extended family; therefore, be it 41 42 RESOLVED, That the Massachusetts Medical Society note with great sadness the 43 passing of Myer Bornstein, MD, with thankfulness and gratitude for the gift of his 44 life and work; and, be it further 45 46 RESOLVED, That expressions of condolence be forwarded with a copy of this

Supporting Physicians, Patients, and Communities

Dear Friends and Colleagues,

As the newly elected chair of the board of directors I am excited to share with you highlights of what we have been able to accomplish this past year, because of the financial support and continued commitment from our donors to our mission of supporting physicians, patients, and communities.

These past several months have been challenging for everyone as we respond to the COVID-19 health crisis. This past spring, we were forced to postpone our 20th anniversary celebration event, which was expected to raise a significant amount of funds for our grant programs. Despite these challenges, the Foundation continued to support organizations providing health care services to vulnerable populations, many of which pivoted operations to respond to the pressing needs of their constituents, by providing grants to 17 organizations across the Commonwealth, totaling more than \$230,000. Additionally, the Foundation awarded a total of \$20,000 in grants to six medical students and six resident physicians who will learn through international travel how to provide care in limited-resource settings. Unfortunately, with travel restrictions in place much of this travel has been postponed.

We don't know what the future will hold, but it is imperative we continue to receive your support as we do know that persistent challenges in access to appropriate health care for the underserved and the most vulnerable patients in our communities continue to emerge. As physician leaders we are committed to filling major gaps in care and services in the Commonwealth, ensuring that people will get the health care they need and deserve. We cannot do this alone!
